44 Members Recognized for Outstanding 2024 Safety Records, One Individual Honored with Mike Corbett Memorial Award

ACCNJ also honored an individual with the Mike Corbett Memorial Award, which recognizes someone who embodies a commitment to construction safety.

In May of this year, ACCNJ hosted an <u>Industry Safety Day</u> to highlight the importance of safety on construction sites and share best practices for protecting both workers and the surrounding community. The theme of ACCNJ's 2025 Industry Safety Day was accountability. Events emphasized that a culture focused on accountability works to proactively minimize exposure to hazards in the workplace.
